



Friends, one of the hallmarks of the Christmas story is when the angels appear to the shepherds and proclaim, "Peace on earth". Jesus brings us peace in several ways. First, he gives us inner peace. Because of his work on the cross, we have a chance to receive salvation and be recon-

ciled with God. We also have the peace of mind knowing God will heal this broken world. Second, we have peace with others. We put aside our differences, because we belong to the same family and have the same purpose: to let others know about the peace of Christ. The Hebrew word for peace: Shalom is, in essence, how things are meant to be: a slice of heaven. Peace from God, allows us to trust God despite the dark, scary world around us.

We know that between the historical coming of Jesus and the majestic coming of Jesus in his second coming, there is a mystical third coming of Jesus. This intermediate coming is a hidden one, it is in spirit and in power. In the first he was our redemption, in the last He is our life, and, in the middle, he is our rest and consolation. It is not a sheer invention; Jesus said, "if anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him." So, if you keep the word, it will keep you. The Prophet says, "thy word is kept in the Heart, so that I may not sin against you." Let the word enter your very being and feed on goodness and your soul will delight in its rich-

The coming of Jesus makes a new world order. He brings peace and everlasting life. What prevents us from being transformed by Jesus is our anxieties and worries of daily life. Jesus appreciated childlikeness, it is the receptivity like a child that enables a person to experience Christ as he comes in spirit and power. Jesus became the sinless child of his Father and received all power and authority in heaven and earth from the father. Jesus entered the human family through the virgin's womb to destroy death and to bring us the joy of salvation. Mary's maternal intercession can help us persevere in our struggles with the devil, sinful desires and the world. Happy feast of the Immaculate Conception, the patroness of the USA and of our parish.
