

Friends, the Catholic Church dedicates September to Our Lady of Sorrows and celebrates her feast day on September 15. The feast commemorates the close relationship between the Virgin Mary and Jesus, and the sorrows she experienced as a result of his mission, especially during his passion and death.

These sorrows include:

- · The prophecy of Simeon
- The flight into Egypt
- The loss of Jesus in the temple
- Mary and Jesus' meeting on the way to Calvary
- · The crucifixion
- · Taking Jesus' body down from the cross
- Jesus' burial

The readings of today speak of the word of God as source of all blessings. Moses tells the people that by obeying the statutes and decrees you will live and possess the land that the Lord God is giving you as a gift. The world will say this nation is wise and intelligent and what nation is that God is so close whenever they call upon Him. St. James in the second reading says that every good gift comes from the "Father of lights" who gives word of truth. He points toward the incarnate word of truth-Jesus-who further imparts God's true word in the Gospel.

We return to the Gospel of Mark today. Mark reports that they were accustomed to various cleansing rituals in their everyday life, especially ritual hand washing. These rituals were thought of as ways to keep the law of Moses and live wisely. When asked why Jesus' disciples eat without ritual washing, He gives a strong response. Jesus quotes Isaiah to explain that their ritual cleansing practices are human innovations, explicitly forbidden by Moses. Jesus then explains defilement is not about what we take in from the outside world. Rather, a list of vices shows clearly that defilement comes out from within. So, we do well to ask what we are putting out into the world.
