Jesus is rarely angry in the gospels. But today is one of the days when he is, and it's worth looking at exactly why. It starts with the famous passage when Peter is the only one among the disciples, who can correctly answer the question about who

Jesus is: He is the Messiah, the anointed one, the savior who is going to gather his scattered people together and show them the way to freedom. But then, Peter shows that he doesn't understand everything about what that means. Jesus decides to say more about where this life of the Messiah is going. He demonstrated his solidarity with us by generously renouncing himself and taking the cross.

He did the Father's will by proclaiming and securing salvation for humanity. Through his action, Christ proved his love for us. Also, through it, He demonstrated his faith in His father. Christ proved his love for us by being practical. He prayed and also offered his own life for us. Practical Christianity means faith in action. It means sacrifice. It means sharing in the pain and joy of others. God desires everyone including the wicked to know Christ and experience his love and forgiveness that everyone may enter His Kingdom. Like Peter we are reminded that we need to get behind Jesus. Do we expect Him to walk with us or follow us? No, we are to follow Jesus and walk with Him to salvation.

In today's gospel, Jesus spoke about how he would fulfill the prophecy of Isaiah. His mission was to redeem humanity through his suffering and death. However, Peter did not understand this. Although he was right in professing that Jesus is the Messiah, it was difficult for him to understand how Jesus could offer himself to be killed for the salvation of all. It is to fulfill the desire of the Father that everyone be saved through faith in Jesus Christ. We too are called to go out to love and serve the Lord in our brothers and sisters. Let everyone know that there is salvation only in Jesus.
