Friends, the readings this weekend call us to live with wisdom and understanding. They encourage us to seek true nourishment from Jesus, the Bread of Life, and live in a way that pleases God. The readings highlight the need for spiritual nourishment. Just as our bodies need food, our souls need the sustenance that comes from

Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus promises eternal life to those who believe in Him.

Paul encourages us to always give thanks to God. This thankfulness helps us to live joyfully and gratefully, recognizing God's many blessings. He speaks of expressing joy through spiritual music. This joy comes from living in harmony with God's will and being filled with the Holy Spirit. Ephesians remind us to live with wisdom, understanding God's will for our lives. It urges us to be careful in how we live, making the most of every opportunity. It calls us to live with a clear mind and a focused heart. Wisdom is shown as a treasure that helps us make wise choices and live fulfilling lives. Proverbs urge us to value wisdom above material possessions and to apply it in our daily actions, leading to success and harmony.

In the Gospel, Jesus offers himself as the living bread from heaven. Those who partake in Him through the Eucharist will receive eternal life. We need to be grafted into His body to have eternal life. John 6 highlights the importance of the Eucharist in our worship. Jesus declares that He is the bread of life and promises eternal life to those who eat His flesh and drink His blood. He declared His abiding presence with those who take part in it; "Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood remains in Me, and I in them". He transforms us into His likeness through His abiding presence with us as we take part in the Eucharist. This teaching is challenging, but it emphasizes the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Through the Eucharist, we are united with Jesus, experiencing an intimate relationship with Him. This union is central to our Catholic faith. This mystery reminds us that we are the Body of Christ, full of dignity and power.
