# **Harvest Dinner**

Sunday, October 27th @ 4:30p.m. St. Mary's Parish Hall, Florence



Friends, the readings for this weekend highlight the importance of unity, family, and following God's will. They remind us of the value of marriage, the role of children, and Jesus' teachings on these topics. God created animals and birds for man to name, but none was suitable. God then made a woman from man's rib. Man

recognized her as his equal and partner. The union between Christ and the church is inseparable. Jesus calls for the same fidelity and commitment in marital relationships. This calls us to follow His example of humility and sacri-

The Pharisees tested Jesus about divorce, and he emphasized God's original design for marriage. The union between man and woman was originally conceived in the plan of God. Jesus teaches that marriage is a sacred bond. He reminds us that this bond should not be broken lightly. God created woman as a partner for man, showing that marriage is meant to be a union of equals. This unity is blessed by God. Family as the basic unit of society through which children are received from the moment of conception. Jesus' love for children highlights the importance of nurturing and caring for family members. Salvation is a gift to be received with childlike trust and openness. Jesus was made lower than the angels to taste death for the salvation of all to establish our union with God.

Today the prayer based on Psalm 128 asks God to bless our homes and families. "Blessed are those who fear the Lord and follow his ways. They will enjoy prosperity, family blessings, and peace. May the Lord bless us throughout our lives." It highlights the importance of trusting in God's will and growing in faith. The prayer seeks God's provision and protection, asking for joyful and loving days filled with peace and laughter. By focusing on the blessings that come from following God, it encourages families to stay close to Him and find comfort in His presence throughout their lives.
